

Scripting for watercolor with 2nd grade, or **tempera cakes**

Materials I need for the students

- their faces—sorted for easy pass out
- sunglasses paper
- any sunglasses that they already drew or finished
- tempera, two per table,
- or watercolors- one per person
- water for each table, bins and cups
- paintbrushes
- printouts for early finisher
- pencils

Demo for the students

- show them how to mark where their eyes are
- stack up your heads in a pile as soon as you do this step so we can put them away and keep them away from any paint!
- draw your shapes for your glasses
- nosepiece
- trace in sharpie marker
- then paint
 - o dip your brush in water
 - o paint on the paint
 - o when it seems like the paint is running out on your brush, go back for more
 - o if the paint seems too wet and runny, dry your brush and add less water. You can also use your paper towel to lightly dry anything that is too wet and runny
 - o if your paint seems very dry and not smooth, dip your brush in the water and add it to the paint
 - o with watercolor, the more water you add the lighter the color, the less water you use, the brighter the color.
 - o paint on your picture
 - o changing colors, swish your paint in the water, paint on a new color, paint your picture.
- When you are finished with your picture, put it on the drying rack, and then clean up only your area!
- then come up and get an early finisher!
